Dunedin General Ordinances: Section 10-5 Animal Control

- (a) For the purposes of this section the following definitions shall apply:
 - (1) Animal. Any living creatures of the subphylum vertebrata excepting there from Homo sapiens.
 - (2) Owner. Any person having a right of property in an animal, or who keeps or harbors an animal, or who has an animal in such person's care or acts as its custodian or who permits such animal to remain on or about any premises occupied or controlled by such person.
 - (3) Private property. Property in which the owner of the animal has not proprietary, fee simple, leasehold or other recognized legal interest.
 - (4) Public property. Any park, playground area or any other lands owned or controlled by the city or other governmental or public agency, including streets, rights-of-way and medians; whether signage is present or not which precludes unleashed or unrestrained animals.
- (b) No owner of an animal shall permit such animal to go on public property unless such animal is firmly secured by a substantial leash or other restraining device having the same effect as a leash for animals not appropriate for leash restraint, held by the owner, such leash or other restraining device not to exceed six feet in length, a retractable leash mechanism not greater than 16 feet in length, or unless such animal is enclosed in a cage sufficient to prohibit its escape therefrom.
- (c) No owner shall permit such animal to go on private property without the consent of the owner or occupant of the private property.
- (d) No owner of an animal shall allow such animal to deposit excrement on public property or on private property of another unless such owner immediately removes such excrement.

- (e) No owner of an animal shall allow such animal to run unconfined on public property except where specific signage allows such activity and in enclosed public lands specified for such purpose.
- (f) As an exception to the animal confinement restrictions set forth in this section, seeing-eye or guide pets and non-human primates of the genus Cebus specially trained for the purpose of providing personal care services to individuals with disabilities shall be permitted on public property, if under the control of the owner.
- (g) The owner of an animal is at all times responsible for its behavior and actions.
- (h) No owner of an animal shall allow such animal, whether confined or restrained or not, to enter into or be on the protective surface of a playground or other areas designated by the city manager.
- (i) As an exception to the animal confinement restrictions in this section, the city manager may designate at his/her discretion designated animals to be unleashed or unrestrained on certain specified public property for the purpose of special events, unique occasions or for other reasons deemed to be in the public interest by the city manager for such limited time periods as the city manager shall deem appropriate and as confirmed in writing.

- Motion made to accept Nov 2019 FECA Board Meeting minutes "as written" by Mary Lyon, 2nd by Todd Brooks. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report – Kelly Dixon

- Fall Festival sponsorship funding of \$205 deposited. \$268.42 was paid out to Kelly Dixon to reimburse food expenditures, kids activities, entertainment and prizes (refer to Nov 2019 FECA Board meeting minutes for more detail).
- Routine Lawn, Lake and Utilities paid.

- Additional expenses: Peter Lontakos Electrical: \$993.34. Note: 50% of this amount will be refunded to FECA in 2020 (from the pre-approved Martha Donald Grant).
- Motion made to accept Dec 2019 FECA Treasurers Report "as written" by Todd Brooks, 2nd by Bill Greenwood. Motion carried.
- Proposed 2020 Annual budget comments/revisions:
 - Annual Dues Estimates: 355 households x \$45 = \$15,975
 - o 2020 monthly lawn care will increase 14% (old: \$250, new: \$285)
 - Kelly Dixon followed up with SunTrust and confirmed that CD interest payout after 12 months (2020) will be approximately \$140.
 - Note: Address for CD was corrected to be the current FECA Treasurer's home address (financial institution does not permit PO Box for address)

- President Matt Stevens would like the Board to agree on the guest speaker for the 2020
 Annual Homeowners Meeting.
 - Matt did reach out to Jennifer Bramley (Dunedin City Manager). There is interest in attending; however, her availability has not yet been confirmed (as of December 10^{th)}.
 - Matt also reached out to the *Pinellas County* Sheriff's Department who noted that they are willing to commit a speaker (safety, traffic, etc).

- FECA Board has determined that Dec 26th will be the cutoff date. If Jennifer Bramley is available, proceed with Dunedin City Manager as speaker; otherwise, book a speaker from Sherriff's department.

Old Business:

• 2019 Entrance Signs Project Update:

 Bill Greenwood approached *Lannie Sheets* from the City of Dunedin and successfully obtained supplemental *Martha Donald Grant* funding which would permit the FECA Board to proceed with raised (3 dimensional) lettering for the Palm Harbor Entrance Signs:

- Jessica Parchman noted that USA Sign, Inc. will be onsite Dec 12th to measure the Palm Blvd signs for replacement.
- Estimated replacement of existing Palm Blvd signs: January 31st, 2020
- Todd Brooks noted that concerns of reflective lighting on flat signs are not going to impact drivers. Ed Kelb clarified that his concerns were not the potential impact to drivers, but rather that illuminated flat signage would produce a "billboard" effect whereby the signs would appear less visually appealing at the main entrance to FE.

- Motion from Bill Greenwood to approve the additional cost to signage (resulting in signage cost of \$2722.63 ... less \$1361.32 in grant funding ... for a total FECA signage cost of \$1363.32). Motion 2nd by Kelly Dixon. Motion carried.
- President Matt Stevens noted that the FECA Board should be prepared for questions as to why the Brady Drive entrances were not considered for raised (3 dimensional) lettering. The reasoning is that Brady Drive signs have been subject to the "wear and tear" of children sitting on the Brady Drive entrance signs which caused some damage to raised 3 dimensional lettering.

• Traffic Enforcement

 Beginning in 2020, the Pinellas County Sherriff's Department will begin targeted enforcement of "hot spots" in Fairway Estates where drivers may be violating speed limits or ignoring Stop Signs.


New Business:

Memory Walk

- The Lake Saundra sign is showing some deterioration. The Martha Donald
 Neighborhood Enhancement Program cannot be applied to projects at Lake Saundra.
 The FECA Board is looking at ways to fund a replacement sign in 2021. A Memorial
 Walk might be a viable candidate to raise funds to replace the sign in 2021.
- A Memorial Walk would be a way for residents of FE to memorialize family and events by engraving a paver with a customized memorial.
