Officers Reports:

<u>Secretary's Report – Ed Kelb</u>

- Motion made by Kelly Dixon to waive reading of the Oct 2021 FECA Board Meeting minutes. 2nd by Todd Brooks. Motion carried.
- Motion made by Kelly Dixon to accept the Oct 2021 FECA Board Meeting minutes "as written".
 2nd by Todd Brooks. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report – Kelly Dixon

- Refer to full reports online.
- We are at 384 houses paid for 2021. 74.7% participation. Just one less than last year's total of 385 houses. Previous dues reports were too high by one payment that was inadvertently credited as a dues payment but was in fact a sponsorship check. While tabulating the sponsorship money available to Fall Fest and Holiday Party this error was discovered and corrected.
- SunTrust erroneously deposited \$818.57 of Treasurer Kelly Dixon's personal funds into the FECA Checking account. The Treasurer indicated she would like to write herself a check to correct this error.
 - Motion made by Todd Brooks to for the FECA Treasurer to reimburse herself \$818.57.
 2nd by Derrick Beland. Motion carried.
- Routine Lawn, Lake and Utilities were paid.
- Diane Kerfeld (FECA Beautification Chair) was reimbursed \$47.96 for plants
- Our website hosting fee was paid for \$172.08. Note: The budgeted amount was \$143.40 as the amount had not changed in the last 5 years. The Treasurer will adjust for 2022.
- Our two required Bonds were renewed.
- Lake Saundra Sign Replacement & Electrical Work Project:
 - Peter Lontakos Electrical was paid for the electrical work performed at Lake Saundra Park.
 - Precision Sign Group was paid \$750 as a deposit for the new sign at Lake Saundra Park
- The fall *Fairway Focus* was printed and paid to *Area Printing Inc*.
- A check for \$50 was deposited from *Dorie Brown* and credited towards Special Events (sponsorship).
- **2021 Fall Festival** expenses totaled \$693.59. We had a budget of \$1,130 (includes sponsorship money) available:
 - Kelly Dixon directly paid \$631.32 in expenses and requesting reimbursement.
 - Todd Brooks requesting reimbursement of \$62.27 for supplies for the Chili/Cornbread contest
 - See EVENTS for the motion to approve the two reimbursements noted above.

- \$436.41 in sponsorship money is still available to be used for the upcoming 2021
 Holiday Party along with the original \$300 budgeted. Refer to EXHIBIT A.
- Motion made by Todd Brooks to accept the Nov 2021 FECA Treasurer Report "as written". 2nd by Derrick Beland. Motion carried.
- Review of the draft 2022 FECA Budget will continue at the Dec 2021 FECA Board Meeting.

<u>Vice President's Report – Todd Brooks</u>

<u>President's Report – Matt Stevens</u>

- President Matt Stevens brought to the Board's attention an incident at the corner of Palm Blvd and Demaret Drive whereby two SUVs were speeding. One was unable to make the turn, ran down the city sign, drove across a neighbor's lawn and stopped just a couple of feet shy of the house. Matt was asked to attend the Oct Dunedin City Commission Meeting to ensure the city is aware of this ongoing problem in Fairway Estates. Matt spoke at the meeting and was informed that the City is actively hiring an additional employee to assist in addressing issues like these.
- There is increased growth of vegetation around the edges of Lake Saundra, with a noticeable area on the northern side of the lake. There is concern that if left unchecked, this can have an adverse effect on overall health of the lake. Aggressive plants like Pickerel Weed can be healthy in small patches but can quickly get out of hand if not pruned back.

Beautification - Diane Kerfeld

- The *Beautification Committee* is trimming back shrubs surrounding the *Lake Saundra Park* sign in anticipation of the upcoming sign replacement and associated work with the electrical and sprinkler system.
- The Brady Drive monuments have been spruced up with new plants.

Newsletter - Kathy O'Leary

- FECA Newsletter team is working on the January 2022 edition with the focus around the upcoming **Annual Homeowners Meeting** in February 2022.
- Spotlight on Dunedin's *Caledonia Brewing* including information regarding the business impact of incidents like the September 30th fire at the *Dunedin Water Treatment Plant* and the ongoing work to restore the *Reverse Osmosis* (RO) process which removes many of the hard minerals from drinking water.

<u>City Liaison – Betsy Morgan</u>

- Betsy Morgan attended the October meeting of Dunedin Council of Organizations via Zoom.
 Dunedin Vice Mayor Jeff Gow chaired the meeting. Topics of interest:
 - September 30th fire at the *Dunedin Water Treatment Plant*:
 - Cleaning and salvage completed. Citizens still encouraged to conserve water.
 Still a long way to go before the Reverse Osmosis process is restored.
 - New City Hall is scheduled for completion in Sep 2022
 - Input meetings for use of eighteen million dollars from the American Recovery Funds ongoing through November.
 - o Dunedin will have a visitor from our sister city, Sterling, Scotland.
 - Honeymoon Island restoration project nearing completion.

- Motion made by Matt Stevens to add a line item into the 2022 FECA Budget to cover the cost of breakfast for the FECA City Liaison to attend the monthly meeting for the *Dunedin Council of Organizations*. 2nd by Bill Greenwood. Motion carried with one dissent (Treasurer Kelly Dixon).
 - Motion made by Matt Stevens to specifically cap the line item above to \$150 annually.
 2nd by Todd Brooks. Motion carried with one dissent (Treasurer Kelly Dixon).

New Business:

- Spectrum Cable Offer
 - Vice President Todd Brooks was put in contact with a Spectrum (cable) representative.
 If enough neighbors participate in a specific neighborhood, Spectrum is willing to provide discounted cable and internet. For example:
 - All channels (except premium)
 - Two HD boxes
 - Internet speeds up to 400 Mbps
 - Wi-Fi
 - Cost: \$50-\$60 per month (versus retail of approx. \$200 per month)
 - This would require that FECA provide a list of all resident addresses within the association (names not required?).
 - Follow-up Questions:
 - We are a Civic Community Association ... not an HOA. Does this impact the offer?
 - Do they want a list of all 514 addresses within Fairway Estates or just active FECA members?
 - Note: This question would not be applicable to an HOA where dues are mandatory.
