# Fairway Estates Board Meeting Minutes – Date: 09-08-2021

**Deputy Terrance Fallahee** (assigned to Pinellas County: *North District Station Community Policing*, specifically, the city of Dunedin)

- Reemphasized that neither residents nor visitors are permitted to use the *Dunedin Golf Club* course except for paid golfing. This is not a park. Dog walking, bicycling or skateboarding along the golf cart trails, people cutting across the course, golf carts (not engaged in golfing) are <u>not</u> permitted and pose a danger to themselves and golfers. Golf balls hit from the tee can reach speeds of 50mph to 100mph. Bicyclists, dogs and people can damage the greens walking across them after a heavy rain.
- While the *Dunedin Golf Club* course is *City of Dunedin* property, it is categorized as "specific use" property and should not be thought of as a city park.
- Pinellas Trail: The FECA Board previously communicated some concerns regarding increased usage of the trail, electric bikes and skateboards, excessive speeding, etc. Deputy Fallahee communicated our concerns to the *Pinellas County Trail Security Task Force*. There has been a subsequent increased effort to monitor the trail, especially between Palm Blvd and Michigan, as well as Alt-19 and Curlew. Citations have been issued to help address violations (example: violation of cross walk). Deputies monitor the Pinellas Trail via both bicycles and 4-wheel vehicles.

Ms. Tiffini Schwarzkopf – City of Dunedin Engineering & Communications

- There is an upcoming construction effort to install **new watermains**; said project anticipated to directly impact approximately **20% of homeowners in Fairway Estates in 2022**.
- New fittings, valves, underdrains, fire hydrants and the watermains that supply clean drinking water to our homes.
- The underdrains should mitigate the rising water that typically causes cracks and potholes in the street.
- There will be situations where it is necessary to tear up driveways or parts of the lawn; however, it is not possible to determine which residents this will impact at this time. The City of Dunedin will (of course) repair all impacted driveways as well as any street pavement that requires removal.
- While this could change, the streets potentially impacted at this time are **Armour Dr**, **Mangrum Dr**, **Webb Ave and Davies Ave**. Note to newsletter team: This detail not intended for publication as it could change.
- **Requests for Proposal (RFP) have been submitted** to various construction companies; however, a selection has not been made yet.
- The *City of Dunedin (Outreach)* will utilize doorhangers for impacted residents and plans to hold a neighborhood meeting around November to inform residents.
- In scenarios where driveways need to be cut, it will take place in the apron section (typically where a sidewalk would reside ... also known as the "right of way"). This is where the new watermains will be installed. The underdrains will go right next to the driveways.
- Early estimates (guesstimates would be a better choice of wording) is that this **project will begin** sometime between December 2021 and January 2022.
- There is no intention to remove the original water lines or drain lines (cost prohibitive)
- While there will be temporary inconveniences, this is a long overdue project and should be **conveyed in a positive manner** that notes the benefits of this investment for our community.

- Questions:
  - Mary Lyon/Matt Stevens: Will you be doing the entire subdivision at some point?
    - Answer: Yes ... eventually the entire City of Dunedin will be redone. Schedule for completion of entire city not yet known. The City's fiscal year begins in October. Hopefully we'll learn of the FE streets scheduled for fiscal year 2022.
  - Ed Kelb (asking on behalf of FECA Newsletter Team): Is everything discussed here solely to inform the FECA Board, or can this information be shared with FE residents at this time?
    - Answer: The City of Dunedin would prefer to get notification out to residents BEFORE the Newsletter publishes it to prevent an abundance of calls to the City of Dunedin for more information. Tiffini would prefer that the Director of the City of Dunedin Communications provide a response that can be shared with Fairway Estates residents in our Newsletter.
    - Russell Ferlita (Assistant Public Works & Utilities Director / City Engineer) will be the primary contact for residents with questions.
    - Sep 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021 update from Kathy O'Leary: "Tiffini contacted me this week to say that the project is not yet solidified enough to announce in our October newsletter. She will be communicating with us when things are more jelled. Probably later in October."

### Secretary's Report – Ed Kelb

- Motion made by Derrick Beland to waive reading of the Jun 2021 FECA Board Meeting minutes. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kelly. Motion carried.
- Motion made by Derrick Beland to accept the Jun 2021 FECA Board Meeting minutes "as written". 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mary Lyon. Motion carried.

### Treasurer's Report – Kelly Dixon

- Refer to full reports online.
- 383 homeowners have paid 2021 dues. Slightly behind last year's total of 385 houses, but still an excellent turnout for a challenging year (74.5% participation).
- Routine Lawn, Lake and Utilities were paid
- Tree Trimming was paid for at \$4250
- Directors & Officers Insurance was also paid at \$2398
- The FECA Treasurer purchased postage stamps needed for the rest of the year (Newsletter and Annual Dues notices). This was done prior to the August 2021 postage increase of five cents for first class postage. Note: Great planning!
- The FECA Treasurer reviewed our SunTrust CD prior to renewal and determined that we are not getting much interest at today's rates (2020 interest earned = \$120, 2021 interest earned = \$8.00). The Treasurer recommended cashing in the CD for now and moving it to the savings account. If and when CD rates become more attractive, we can roll it back in to a CD without having to wait for a renewal period.
  - Motion made by Marilyn Parnell to cash out CD and roll into Savings until rates are more favorable. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Derrick Beland. Motion carried.
- Motion made by Derrick Beland to accept the **Sep 2021 FECA Treasurer Report** "as written". 2<sup>nd</sup> by Marilyn Parnell. Motion carried.

### Vice President's Report – Todd Brooks

• Nothing to report at this time.

### President's Report – Matt Stevens

- As most of the neighborhood is now aware, there is an alligator (approximately 3 feet in length) that has taken up residence in Lake Saundra. Over the summer, alligator warning signs (two) were installed at the edge of Lake Saundra Park.
- Code enforcement requests continue to come in; however, without deed restrictions, residents are being instructed to refer these complaints to the City of Dunedin (boats, signs in yards, etc.)

• Request from Derrick Beland to review City of Dunedin code to clarify signs placed at the entranceway monuments (real estate, garage sales, parties, etc.)

Motion made by Kelly Dixon to select **Precision Sign Group** (estimated cost of \$1,474.76) as the vendor to replace the **Lake Saundra Park** sign with an additional request to add background texturing, provided that said texturing does not increment the sign cost by more than \$100.  $2^{nd}$  by Ed Kelb. Motion carried.

- Ed Kelb provided the Board a brief background on an **emergency electrical repair** that took place over the summer. \$75.83 in electrical parts was spent to temporarily resolve the issue until an electrician could be engaged to move the outlet off the sign.
- Motion made by Kelly Dixon to select *Peter Lontakos Electrical Services* (estimated cost of \$340.00) as the vendor to perform electrical replacement/relocation at Lake Saundra Park. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Derrick Beland. Motion carried.
- As the electrician of choice has elected to reuse the electrical hardware Ed Kelb purchased over the summer, a motion made by Ed Kelb to be reimbursed \$75.83. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Derrick Beland. Motion carried.
- As some of the information reviewed in this FECA Board meeting may need to be communicated to our residents in a timely manner, Ed Kelb submitted the following motion. 

1) Aluminum vs HDU (high density urethane)?

The Board received an unusually low bid in June from a vendor that produces aluminum signs:

Palm Harbor Sign & Design:	\$337.05	(Aluminum Sign)
Precision Sign Group:	\$1,474.76	(HDU Sign)
DVC Signs:	\$2,328.01	(HDU Sign)
Sign Source:	\$2,670.51	(HDU Sign)

The Board needs to proceed with caution here as FE residents are very vocal about changes they don't agree with ... or anything that reduces the visual appeal of FE.

I've been reviewing subdivision signs throughout Dunedin over the summer and HDU is by far the dominant choice because it provides depth, different grades and looks more visually appealing (<u>in my humble opinion</u>). The Board needs to determine whether the Aluminum option should be considered. See next page for examples:

- 4) Review electrical bids and select a vendor (motion required)
  - a. Background In July 2021 it was brought to my attention that the electrical outlet at Lake Saundra Park was not working. The actual cause of this problem required cable replacement by Duke Energy.

However, in troubleshooting this issue, the existing GFCI outlet had completely deteriorated and literally fell to pieces as I unscrewed the outlet. The weatherproof gasket had deteriorated, and water had corroded everything. I made a judgement call that this was a public hazard and temporarily replaced and repaired the outlet until such a time as the electrician was needed for signage. My cost was \$75.83 in parts. The electrician quotes below factor in reuse of these parts as they are only 2 months old.
